

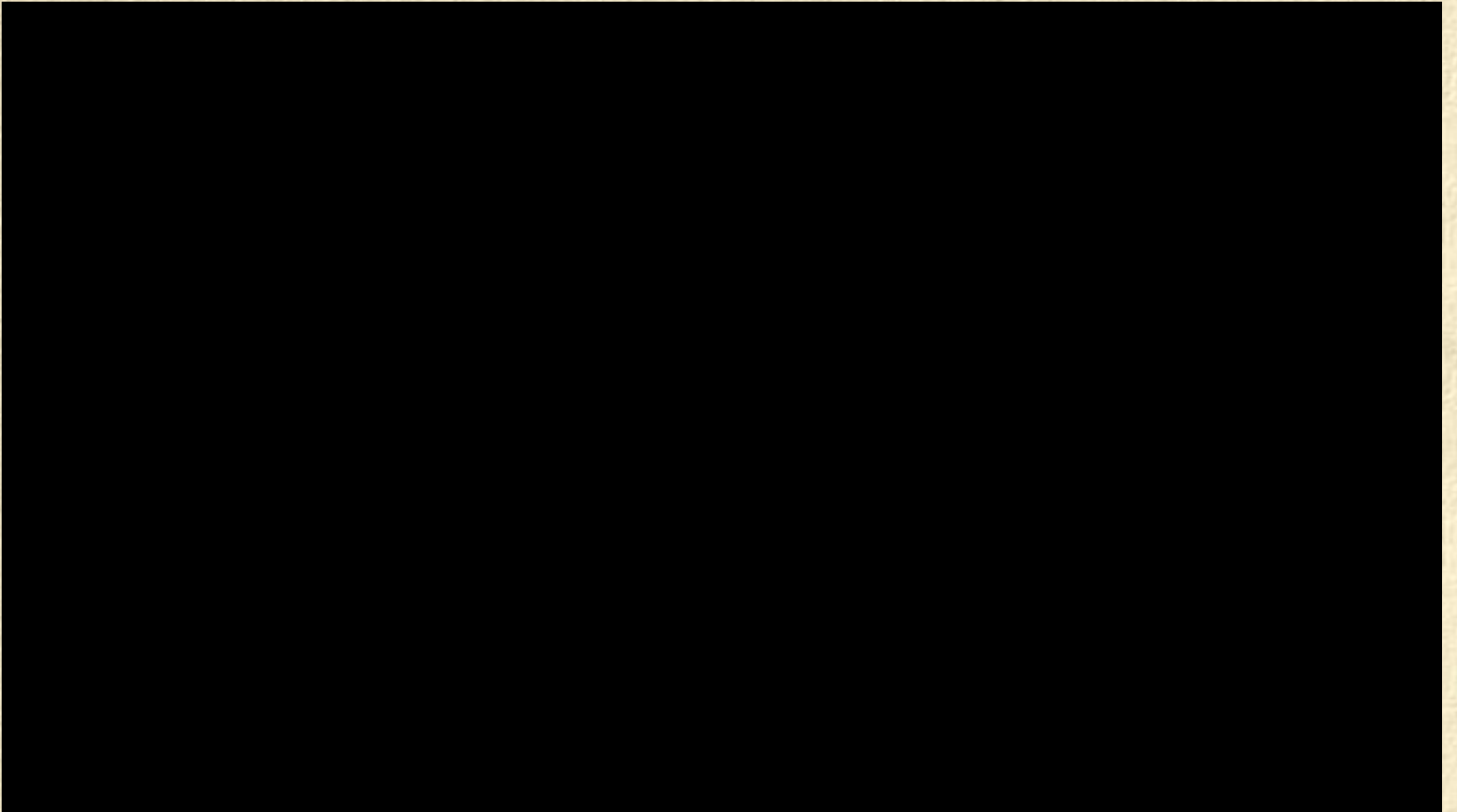

Virginia Tech – nearly 8 shot every 60 seconds

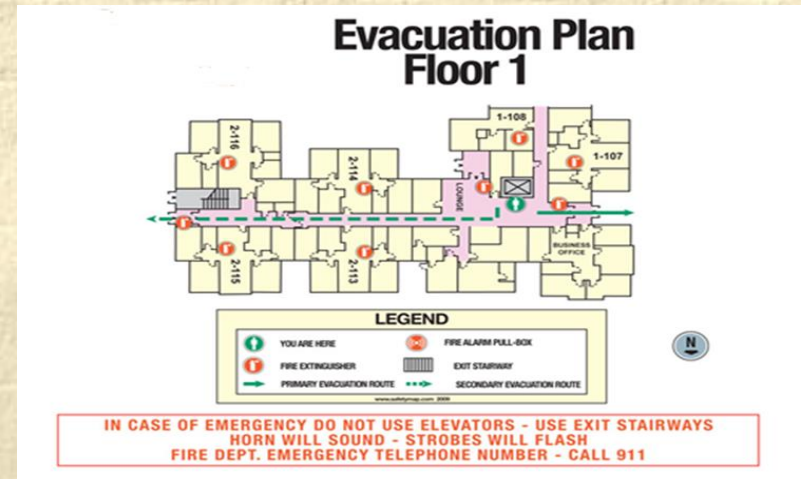


Columbine – 2 shot every 60 seconds

The body will not go where the mind has never been



GET OUT OF DODGE



- What would you do if the building was on fire?
- Smart escape is the best option
- Be a good witness
- Warn others



Hide

- Get out of sight
- Barricade doors and windows
- Cover or Conceal yourself
- Silence cell phone
- Stay still and quiet



FIGHT FOR YOUR LIFE

- Use improvised weapons – fire extinguisher, chair, scissors, pots/pans, pens, books, etc.
- Work as a group – power in numbers
- **THERE ARE NO RULES**



Overwhelm the attacker

- Aim attack on head, eyes, face, neck, groin, joints, other vital areas
- Punch, scratch, bite, kick, use knees and elbows, scream and yell

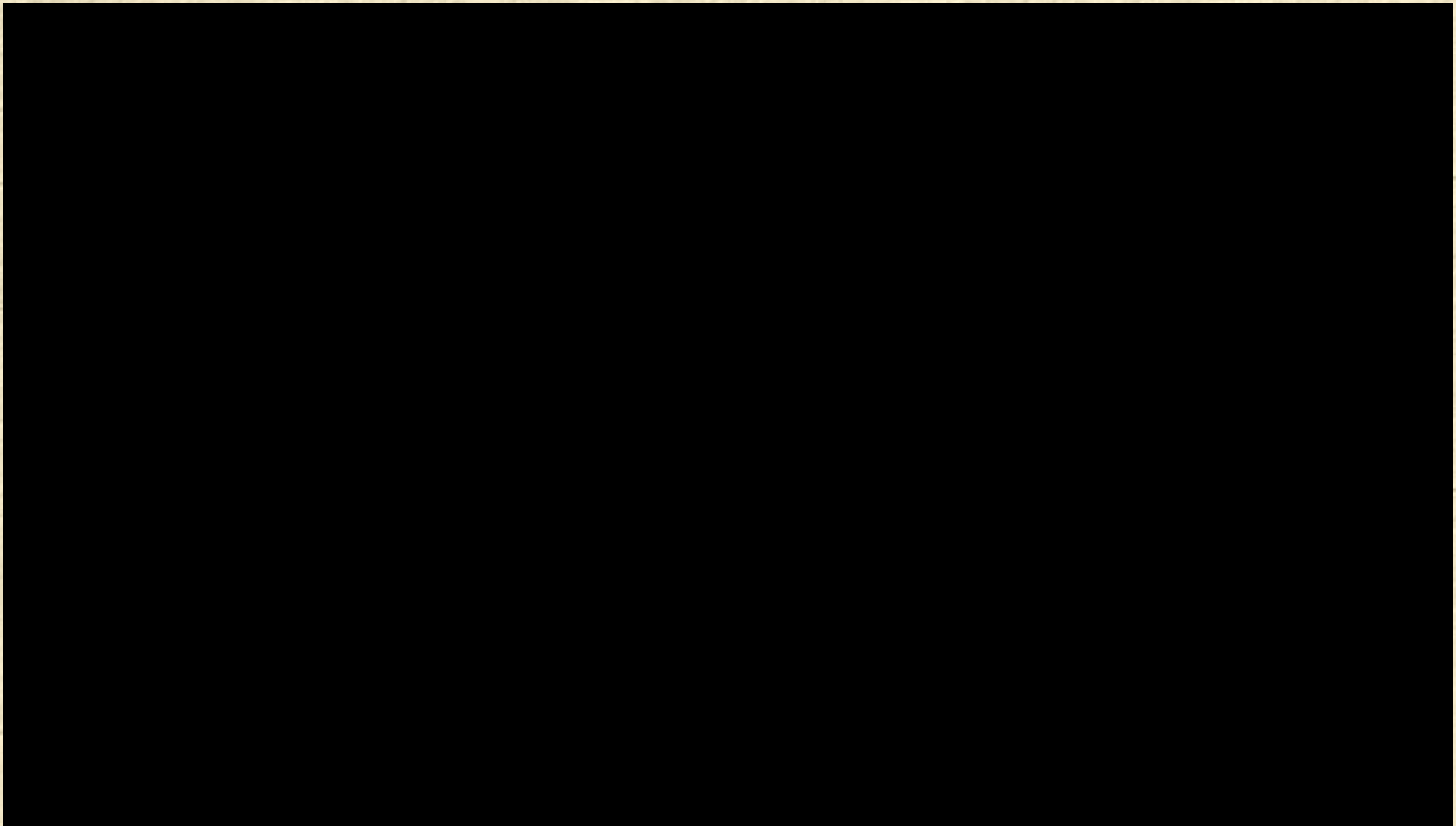


Law Enforcement Response

- Expect a 4-5 minute initial response time
- 100 officers within an hour (multiple agencies)
- First officers on specific mission-

STOP THE THREAT





Law Enforcement Arrival

- Follow instructions
- Raise hands
- Do not make sudden moves toward the officers
- Avoid screaming, yelling
- Leave the area in the direction law enforcement came from.

Post-Response

- Fire Department / Medical
- Rescue Task Force



Take care of yourself and others

- You may need to shelter in place a period of time
- Communicate your location and status to Police dispatch
- Have First Aid kits
- First Aid training
- Predesignated Locations
- Food and Water available



Clearing of building/ Investigation

- Clearing building of suspects could take hours
- Room by room check
- All people screened/ interviewed
- Investigation could take days or weeks



Preparedness - Mindset

- You have a **right to live**
- Don't be a victim
- Be a **survivor**
- Mental commitment –
**You will survive, no
matter what**

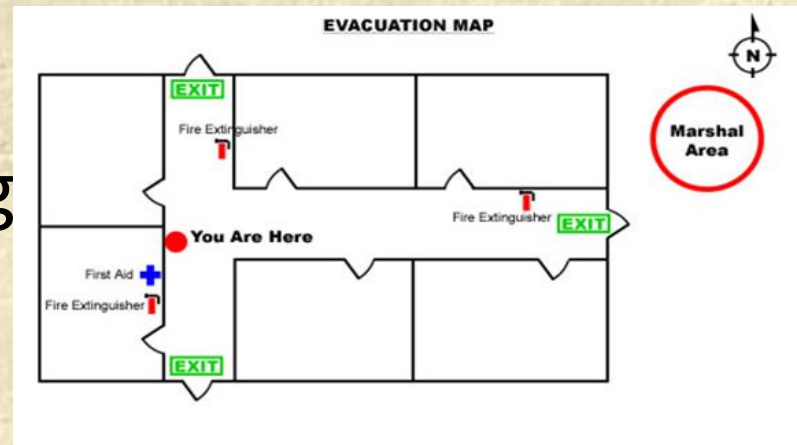
Preparedness – Your workplace

Services Provided:

Special Services/Security administers most of the County's security contract and monitors security guard performance.

Services provided include:

- Security improvements to facilities and placement of security devices
- 24-hour monitoring of safety systems and alarms
- Requests for assistance
- Reporting and investigating incidents
- Escorts for contractor employees and public tours
- Identification badges and access cards
- Parking and carpool permits
- Audiovisual equipment
- Conference room reservations
- Special use permits
- Monitors the cafeteria, snack bars, ATM, and vending machine contracts
- Liaison with local artists for exhibits on County grounds and facilities
- Evacuation Training and Fire Drills
- Vulnerability and Risk Assessments

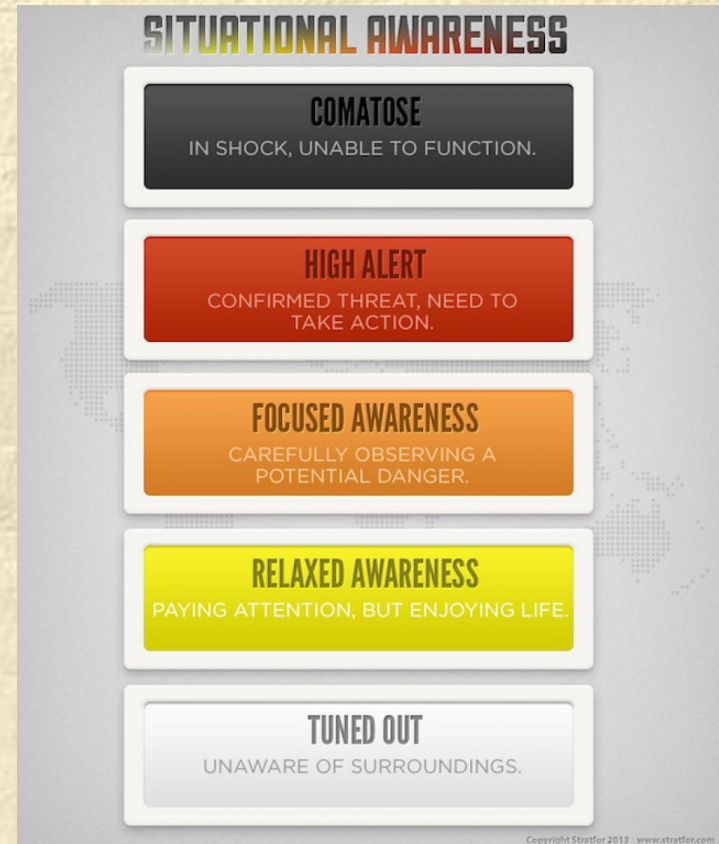
