SUBJECT: Uniform Complaint Procedures

The County Board of Education and County Superintendent recognize that the Ventura County Office of Education (VCOE) has the primary responsibility to ensure compliance with applicable state and federal laws and regulations governing its educational programs. The County Board encourages the early, informal resolution of complaints whenever possible and appropriate. To resolve complaints which cannot be resolved through such informal process, the County Board adopts the uniform system of complaint processes specified in 5 CCR 4600-4670 and incorporates any related procedures approved by the County Superintendent.

COMPLAINTS SUBJECT TO UCP

According to state and federal codes and regulations, the programs and activites subject to the Uniform Complaint Procedure (UCP) are:

- Accommodations for pregnant and parenting students (Education Code 46015)
- Adult Education Programs (Education Code 8500-8538, 52334.7, 52500-52617)
- After School Education and Safety (Education Code 8482-8484.65)
- Agricultural Career Technical Education (Education Code 52460-52462)
- Career Technical and Technical Education; Career Technical and Technical Training Programs (Education Code 52300-52462)
- Child Care and Development (Education Code 8200-8488)
- Compensatory Education (Education Code 54400)
- Consolidated Categorical Aid Programs (Education Code 33315; 34 CFR 299.10-299.12)
- Course Periods without Educational Content (Education Code 51228.1-51228.3)
- Discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying in VCOE programs and activities, including in those programs or activities funded directly by or that receive or benefit from any state financial assistance, based on a person's actual or perceived characteristics of race or ethnicity, color, ancestry, nationality, national origin, immigration status, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital status, pregnancy, parental status, physical or mental disability, medical condition, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, gender expression, or genetic information, or any other characteristic identified in Education Code 200 or 220, Government Code 11135, or Penal Code 422.55, or based on the person's

- association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics (5 CCR 4610)
- Educational and graduation requirements for students in foster care, homeless students, students from military families, and students formerly in a juvenile court school (Education Code 48645.7, 48853, 48853.5, 49069.5, 51225.1, 51225.2)
- Every Student Succeeds Act (Education Code 52059.5; 20 USC 6301 et seq.)
- Local Control and Accountability Plans (LCAP) (Education Code 52075)
- Migrant Education (Education Code 54440-54445)
- Physical Education Instructional Minutes (Education Code 51210, 51222, 51223)
- Reasonable Accommodations to a Lactating Student (Education Code 222)
- Regional Occupational Centers and Programs (Education Code 52300-52334.7)
- School plans for student achievement as required for the consolidated application for specified federal and/or state categorical funding (Education Code 64001)
- School Safety Plans (Education Code 32280-32289)
- School site councils as required for the consolidated application for specified federal and/or state categorical funding (Education Code 65000)
- State Preschool (Education Code 8207-8225)
- State preschool health and safety issues in license-exempt programs (Education Code 8212)
- Student Fees (Education Code 49010-49013)
- Any complaint alleging retaliation against a complainant or other participant in the complaint process or anyone who has acted to uncover or report a violation subject to this policy
- Any other state or federal educational program the Superintendent of Public Instruction or designee deems appropriate including but not limited to:
 - American Indian Education Centers and Early Childhood Education Program Assessments
 - Bilingual Education
 - o California Peer Assistance and Review Programs for Teachers
 - Child Nutrition
 - Economic Impact Aid
 - Special Education
 - o Tobacco-Use Prevention Education

All complainants shall be protected from retaliation, and the confidentiality of the parties involved shall be protected as required by law. For any complaint alleging retaliation or unlawful discrimination (such as discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying), the identity of the complainant, and/or the subject of the complaint if different from the complainant, shall remain confidential when appropriate and as long as the integrity of the complaint process is maintained.

Records of all UCP complaints and the investigations of those complaints are to be maintained in accordance with applicable law and County Superintendent policies and procedures.

NON-UCP COMPLAINTS

The following complaints shall not be subject to the VCOE's UCP but shall be investigated and resolved by the specified agency or through an alternative process:

- 1. Any complaint alleging child abuse or neglect shall be referred to the County Department of Social Services Protective Services Division, or the appropriate law enforcement agency. (5 CCR 4611)
- 2. Any complaint alleging health and safety violations by a child development program shall, for licensed facilities, be referred to the Department of Social Services. (5 CCR 4611)
- 3. Any complaint alleging that a student, while in an education program or activity in which the VCOE exercises substantial control over the context and respondent, was subjected to sexual harassment as defined in 34 CFR 106.30 shall be addressed through the federal Title IX complaint procedures adopted pursuant to 34 CFR 106.44-106.45, as specified in AR 5145.71 Title IX Sexual Harassment Complaint Procedures.
- 4. Any complaint alleging employment discrimination or harassment shall be referred to the County Superintendent for investigation using VCOE procedures, including the right to file the complaint with the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing.
- 5. Any complaint alleging a violation of a state or federal law or regulation related to special education, a settlement agreement related to the provision of a free appropriate public education (FAPE), failure or refusal to implement a due process hearing order to which the VCOE is subject, or a physical safety concern that interferes with the VCOE's provision of FAPE shall be submitted to the California Department of Education (CDE). (5 CCR 3200-3205)
- 6. Any complaint alleging noncompliance of the COE's food service program with laws regarding meal counting and claiming, reimbursable meals, eligibility of children or adults, or use of cafeteria funds and allowable expenses shall be filed with or referred to CDE in accordance with BP 3555 Nutrition Program Compliance. (5 CCR 15580-15584)
- 7. Any allegation of discrimination based on race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability in the VCOE's food service program shall be referred to the U.S. Department of Agriculture in accordance with BP 3555 Nutrition Program Compliance. (5 CCR 15582)
- 8. Any complaint related to sufficiency of textbooks or instructional materials, emergency or urgent facilities conditions that pose a threat to the health or safety of students or staff, or teacher vacancies and misassignments shall be investigated and resolved in accordance with BP 1312.4 Williams Uniform Complaint Procedures and applicable administrative regulations. (Education Code 35186)
