Mr. Taylor welcomed everyone to the meeting and asked for introductions.

Returning Students to School

Mr. Gonzales reviewed the COVID-19 and Reopening In-Person Instruction Framework & Public Health Guidance for K-12 Schools in California, 2020-2021 School Year document previously emailed to the group. He reviewed some helpful items the document listed.

Mr. Gonzales shared the process used when students come on campus at his high school. He explained that there are certain points of entry and temperature checks are completed before students proceed to enter the campus.

Discussion ensued on what districts have begun in person instruction. Students need to be reminded to leave masks on and staff is out on campus to insure they are apart. Some districts are taking students temperatures as students enter the campus. In some districts, they are utilizing touchless thermometers and the teachers are administering those temperature checks.

Mr. Cromwell asked how others are dealing with State testing. Mr. Winters stated they will test students that are on campus and teachers will proctor. They are working on protocol for testing those students still doing distance learning.
