1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

The meeting of the Ventura County Committee on School District Organization was called to order by Vice-Chair Kathi Smith to the Ventura County Committee on School District Organization, at 4:04 p.m. at the Ojai Unified School District, Board Room.

2. Vice-Chair Kathi Smith led the group in the pledge of allegiance.

4. Public Comments

Vice-Chair Kathi Smith asked if there were any public comments. There were none.

5. **Review and Approve minutes: June 19, 2019**

6. **Information about Ojai Unified School District's Desired Change in Election**

Dr. Morse welcomed the County Committee. She shared that the Ojai Unified School District (OUSD), served approximately 2,400 students last year at seven sites. They have added an eighth site in the last month. They opened an independent study school.

Mr. Chittaphong discussed the district demographics and described the population as of the 2010 census data. There is a total population of 21,739 residents living within the OUSD. There could be approximately 4400 residents in each trustee area once they're created. The three largest demographic populations are the Hispanic/Latino at 19.12%, White at 76.01% and Asian at 1.76%. The population of 18 years and older is a total of 17,303 residents.

Mr. Chittaphong shared that the Citizen Voting Age Population (all residents 18 years and older as well as citizens), is 16,409. The OUSD Board of Trustees are focusing on the voting power for the protective classes.

Mr. Chittaphong explained the trustee area process:

- ✓ April 8, 2019 - Board meeting: First Pre-map public hearing and presentation
- ✓ April 17, 2019 - Board meeting: Second Pre-map public hearing
- ✓ May 6, 2019 - Board meeting: First public hearing on trustee area scenarios
 - Public hearing on general waiver request
 - Board consideration on general waiver request
- ✓ June 6, 2019 - Board meeting: Second public hearing on trustee area scenarios
- ✓ June 19, 2019 - Board meeting: Board section on trustee area map
 - Board consideration of change in election method
- ✓ September 4, 2019 – County Committee on School District Organization holds a public hearing and considers approval of change in election method and trustee area map
- ✓ November 2019 – State Board of Education meeting; waiver application consideration
- ✓ January 2020 – Cooperative Strategies sends final trustee area map to the County Registrar of Voters
- ✓ November 2020 – First election held utilizing trustee area.

Dr. Morse shared that through the process prior to September 4, 2019, both of their representatives from both of their unions spoke on the issues at almost every meeting and they had one engaged community member who provided comments at both of their public hearings.

Mr. Chittaphong listed the guidelines of considerations in the trustee areas:

- ✓ Each area shall contain nearly equal number of inhabitants
- ✓ Drawn to comply with the Federal Voting Rights Act
- ✓ Compact and contiguous, as much as possible
- ✓ Respect communities of interest, as much as possible
- ✓ Follow man-made and natural geographic features, as much as possible
- ✓ Respect incumbency, if possible
- ✓ Other local considerations (i.e., school boundaries, locations of school sites)

Mr. Chittaphong showed the two conceptual trustee scenarios that were presented at the OUSD Board meetings. Each trustee area is represented by a color. Trustee area one is yellow, Trustee area two is green, Trustee area three is red, Trustee area four is blue and Trustee area five is purple. Each color is the same for each trustee area for each scenario. They used census blocks when constructing the conceptual trustee scenarios.

The OUSD provided community outreach to their Bargaining Unit as well as the Advisory Committee and posted the information in the newspaper and on the OUSD website. The OUSD Board was being as transparent as possible in trying to engage the community in being involved in the process. On June 19, 2019 the Board selected trustee scenario two. The OUSD Board was trying to get the Hispanic/Latino Citizen Voting Age Population (CVAP), in the proposed trustee areas higher than 13.99% to improve their voting power. In trustee area one the Hispanic/Latino CVAP is 16.26% and in trustee area two the Hispanic/Latino CVAP is 17.54%.

Mr. Perez asked if the OUSD started this transition voluntarily and if the community was in favor of it. The answer was yes, it was voluntarily, and the community didn't have strong opinions any way.

Dr. Morse shared there was also some consideration about the two elementary schools, Meiners Oaks and Mira Monte, in keeping them in one trustee area instead of splitting them up.

7. Public Hearing:

Vice-Chair Kathi Smith opened the public hearing at 4:24 p.m. on the Ojai Unified School District's desired change in election process from an at-large electoral process to a by-trustee area election process, pursuant to Education Code Section §5019(c)(1) and request that the State Board of Education waive the election requirements of Education Code Sections §5020 and §5030 in order to ensure the timely adoption of trustee areas and the District's transition from its current at-large electoral process to a by-trustee area election. Vice-Chair Kathi Smith asked if the public wished to make a statement. No comments from the public were made.

Vice-Chair Kathi Smith closed the public hearing at 4:25 p.m.

8. Discussion and Action:

A motion was made by Patricia Phelps to adopt County Committee resolution 19-05 approving the establishment of trustee areas and changing the method of election to a by-trustee area election process in the Ojai Unified School District. Motion was seconded by Terri Lisagor.

Vice-Chair Kathi Smith called for the vote. Motion passed unanimously.

Once the OUSD changes their methodology when the new census data is out, it is up to the school board to consider any future changes, should they need to stay in compliance with the California Voting Rights Act.

Ms. Key explained the LEA Election Methodology handout has been updated and includes the most recent action in Ojai on September 4, 2019. Ms. Key anticipates Santa Paula Unified School District could potentially change to a by-trustee area election system later in 2019.

COUNTY COMMITTEE RESOLUTION NUMBER 19-05

RESOLUTION OF THE VENTURA COUNTY COMMITTEE ON SCHOOL DISTRICT ORGANIZATION APPROVING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF TRUSTEE AREAS AND CHANGING THE METHOD OF ELECTION TO A BY-TRUSTEE AREA ELECTION PROCESS IN THE OJAI UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, a proposal to establish trustee areas and change the method of election to a by-trustee area election process was presented to the Ventura County Committee on School District Organization ("County Committee") by the Board of Education ("Board") of the Ojai Unified School District; and

WHEREAS, the Board of the Ojai Unified School District has adopted a resolution declaring its intent to seek a waiver of the election requirements from the State Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, Education Code section §5019(c)(1) provides that a proposal to establish trustee areas may be initiated by resolution of the governing board of a district; and

WHEREAS, Education Code section §5019(c)(2) further provides that when a proposal is made by a governing board of a district to establish trustee areas, the county committee on school district organization shall call and conduct at least one hearing in the district on the matter; and

WHEREAS, Education Code section §5030 provides that whenever trustee areas are established in a district, provisions shall be made for one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members; and

WHEREAS, Education Code section §5020 provides that a resolution of a county committee on school district organization approving a proposal to establish trustee areas, and to adopt one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members specified in Education Code section §5030, shall constitute an order of election which shall be presented to the electors of the district not later than the next succeeding election for members of the governing board; and

WHEREAS, the County Committee met on September 4, 2019, to consider the proposal to establish trustee areas and change the method of election to a by-trustee area election process in the Ojai Unified School District; and

WHEREAS, the County Committee meeting on September 4, 2019, took place within the boundaries of the Ojai Unified School District, and the meeting included a public hearing in accordance with Education Code section §5019(c); and

WHEREAS, by Resolution Numbers 18-19-18 and 18-19-31, the Board of the Ojai Unified School District determined that an at-large method of election could be subject to legal challenge under the California Voting Rights Act of 2001 and adopted a by-trustee area electoral system for consideration by the County Committee; and

WHEREAS, Ojai Unified School District declared its intent to request that the State Board of Education waive the election requirements of Education Code section §5020 and §5030 in order to ensure the timely adoption of trustee areas and the district's transition from its current at-large electoral process; and

WHEREAS, having consideration of the proposal of the Board of the Ojai Unified School District to establish trustee areas and change the method of election to a by-trustee area election process as set forth in its Resolution Numbers 18-19-18 and 18-19-31 as well as public comments, the County Committee recommends approval of the proposal of the Board of the Ojai Unified School District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Committee hereby finds the foregoing recitals to be true and correct; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the County Committee hereby establishes trustee election areas within the Ojai Unified School District as set forth in the District's Resolution Numbers 18-19-18 and 18-19-31; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the County Committee hereby adopts, as the method of election governing board members to the Board of Education of the Ojai Unified School District, that method of election specified in Education Code section §5030(b), which provides one or more members residing in each trustee area be elected by the registered voters of that particular trustee area; and

BE IT FURTHER AND FINALLY RESOLVED that this action of the County Committee establishing trustee election areas and adopting one of the alternative methods of electing governing board members specified in Education Code section §5030 shall not be deemed to constitute an order of election if the State Board of Education grants the district's waiver and if such waiver is granted, trustee area elections shall be commenced effective the next succeeding Board member election in November 2020.



RESOLUTION NO. 18-19-18

**RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO INITIATE THE PROCESS
OF ESTABLISHING TRUSTEE AREAS AND
ELECTIONS BY-TRUSTEE AREAS**

WHEREAS, the Ojai Unified School District (“District”) does not have trustee areas for the members of its Board of Education (“Board”), and the District currently utilizes an “at-large” method of election to select Board members; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes the current at-large method of election serves the needs of the District and, as the District’s policy-making body, the Board ensures the District provides a high quality educational experience to its students in accordance with the desires of the community, and federal and state laws; and

WHEREAS, the Board is aware that under state law an at-large method of election may be deemed to impair the ability of some voters to elect candidates of their choice or to influence the outcome of elections and, therefore, may be subject to challenge under the California Voting Rights Act of 2001, California Elections Code §§ 14025, et seq. (“CVRA”); and

WHEREAS, the Board, based on this awareness, has had an ongoing interest in the issue, and has decided to initiate the process of establishing trustee areas and changing the method of electing members of the Board, in order to ensure compliance with the CVRA or, at minimum, avoid the potential for costly litigation under the CVRA; and

WHEREAS, by-trustee area electoral systems are not vulnerable to challenge under the CVRA; and

WHEREAS, in a by-trustee area system of election, candidates for the Board must reside within a trustee area, and candidates are elected only by the voters of that trustee area; and

WHEREAS, transitioning to a by-trustee area election method is a time-consuming process, which requires public input and the involvement of the County Committee on School District Organization and the State Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, with an understanding of the challenges inherent in completing the transition, the Board intends to complete the process of transitioning to trustee areas, and election of Board members by trustee area, commencing with the November 2020 election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby finds the foregoing recitals to be true and correct; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board directs the Superintendent or his designee to immediately initiate the legal and regulatory process to establish trustee areas within the District, as provided in Education Code section 5019, in sufficient time for trustee areas to be established for the November 2020 election of members of the Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board directs the Superintendent or his designee to immediately initiate the legal and regulatory process of changing the method of electing members of the Board, from the current at-large system whereby each member of the Board is elected by the registered voters of the entire District (Education Code section 5030(a)), to a method which provides that Board members residing in each trustee area will be elected by the registered voters of that particular trustee area (Education Code 5030(b)), in sufficient time for the new method of electing members of the Board to be in place for the November 2020 election; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board directs the Superintendent or his designee to collaborate with a demographer to prepare draft by-trustee area map scenarios for review and input by the Board and members of the public at upcoming meetings and public hearings; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent or his designee is authorized to initiate the legal and regulatory process to seek a waiver from the State Board of Education, of the requirements of Education Code section 5020 and related statutes, so that action of the County Committee on School District Organization establishing trustee election areas and adopting one of the alternative methods of electing Board members specified in Education Code section 5030 does not constitute an order of election, so that trustee area elections can commence effective with the November 2020 election; and

BE IT FURTHER AND FINALLY RESOLVED that the Superintendent or his designee is authorized to do all things necessary and proper to accomplish the purposes of this Resolution.



**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE
OJAI UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT RECOMMENDING
THAT THE VENTURA COUNTY COMMITTEE ON SCHOOL DISTRICT
ORGANIZATION APPROVE AND ESTABLISH TRUSTEE AREAS
FROM WHICH THE OJAI UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT
TRUSTEES WILL BE ELECTED
IN A BY-TRUSTEE AREA ELECTION PROCESS**

WHEREAS, The Ojai Unified School District ("District") currently uses an at-large system of electing members of its Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, At-large electoral systems such as the Districts are subject to challenge under the California Voting Rights Act of 2001, codified at sections 14025 - 14032 of the California Elections Code ("CVRA"); and

WHEREAS, By-trustee area electoral systems are not vulnerable to challenge under the CVRA; and

WHEREAS, In a by-trustee area system of election, candidates for the District's Board of Education (the "Board") must reside within a specific geographic subarea of the District called a "trustee area" and candidates are elected only by the voters of that trustee area; and

WHEREAS, One method of transitioning from an at-large electoral system to a by trustee area electoral system is for the school district board of education to petition the local county committee on school district organization by resolution to initiate the transition under California Education Code section 5019(c)(1); and

WHEREAS, the Ventura County Committee on School District Organization ("Committee") has indicated that it will initiate this process on behalf of the District at the District's request, and will consider any recommendation on specific trustee areas made by the District; and

WHEREAS, District held two public hearings on April 8, 2019 and April 17, 2019 to receive public input on drafting trustee area map plans ("Plans") and thereafter, District consultants created two (2) draft map plans that were circulated for public review at community forums held May 1, 2019, and May 3, 2019; and online on the District's website; and


WHEREAS, Pursuant to Elections Code section 10010, the District held properly noticed public hearings regarding the proposed trustee area plans on May 6, 2019 and June 6 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Board has considered all public input and comment on the Plans; and

WHEREAS, the Board has adopted Scenario 2 and hereby recommends Scenario 2 to the Committee for its consideration based upon the findings, analysis and recommendations contained in the report attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A"; and

the Board's determination forthwith and provide whatever assistance may be required by the Committee to complete the process.

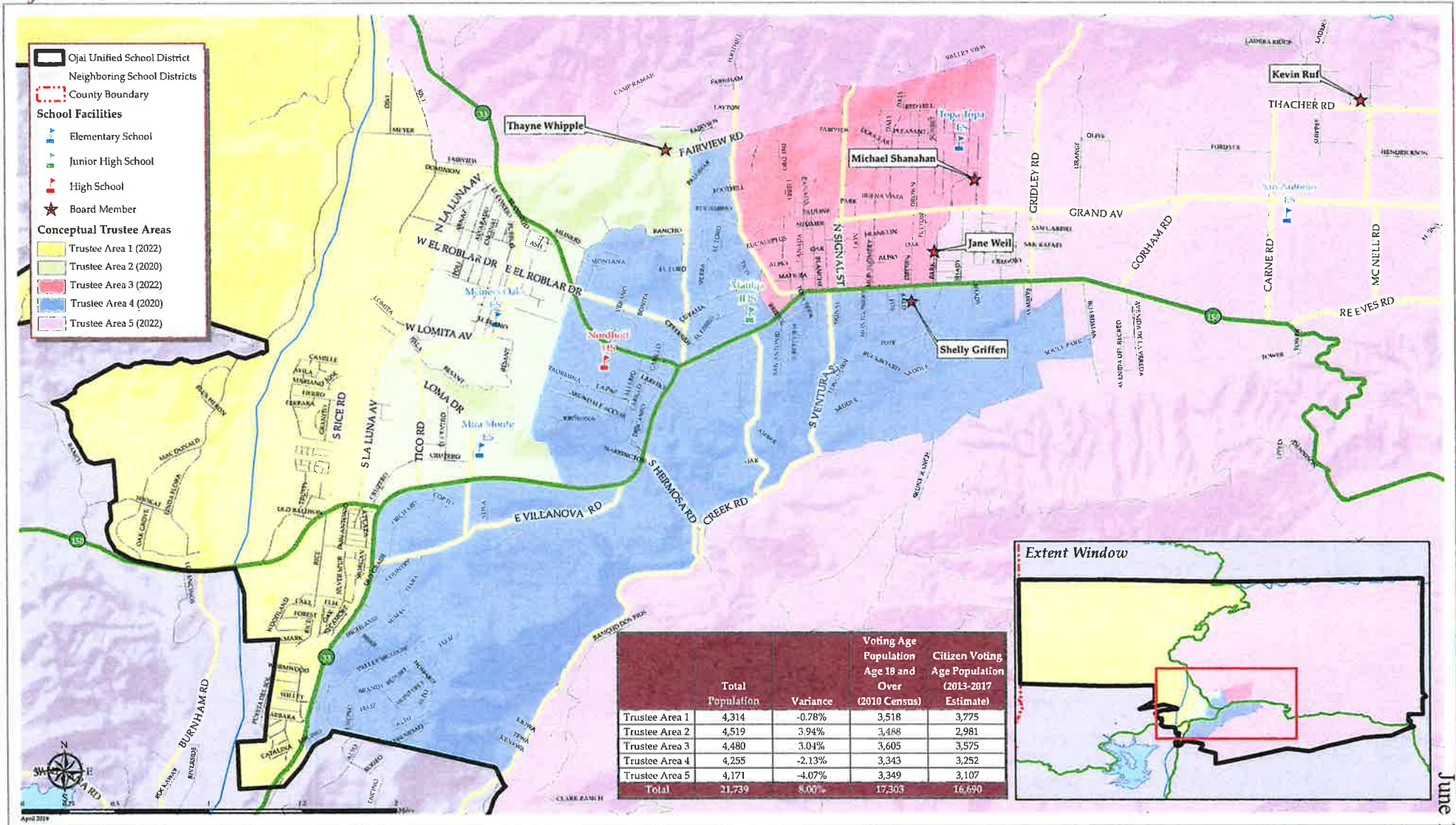

APPROVED TRUSTEE AREA MAP

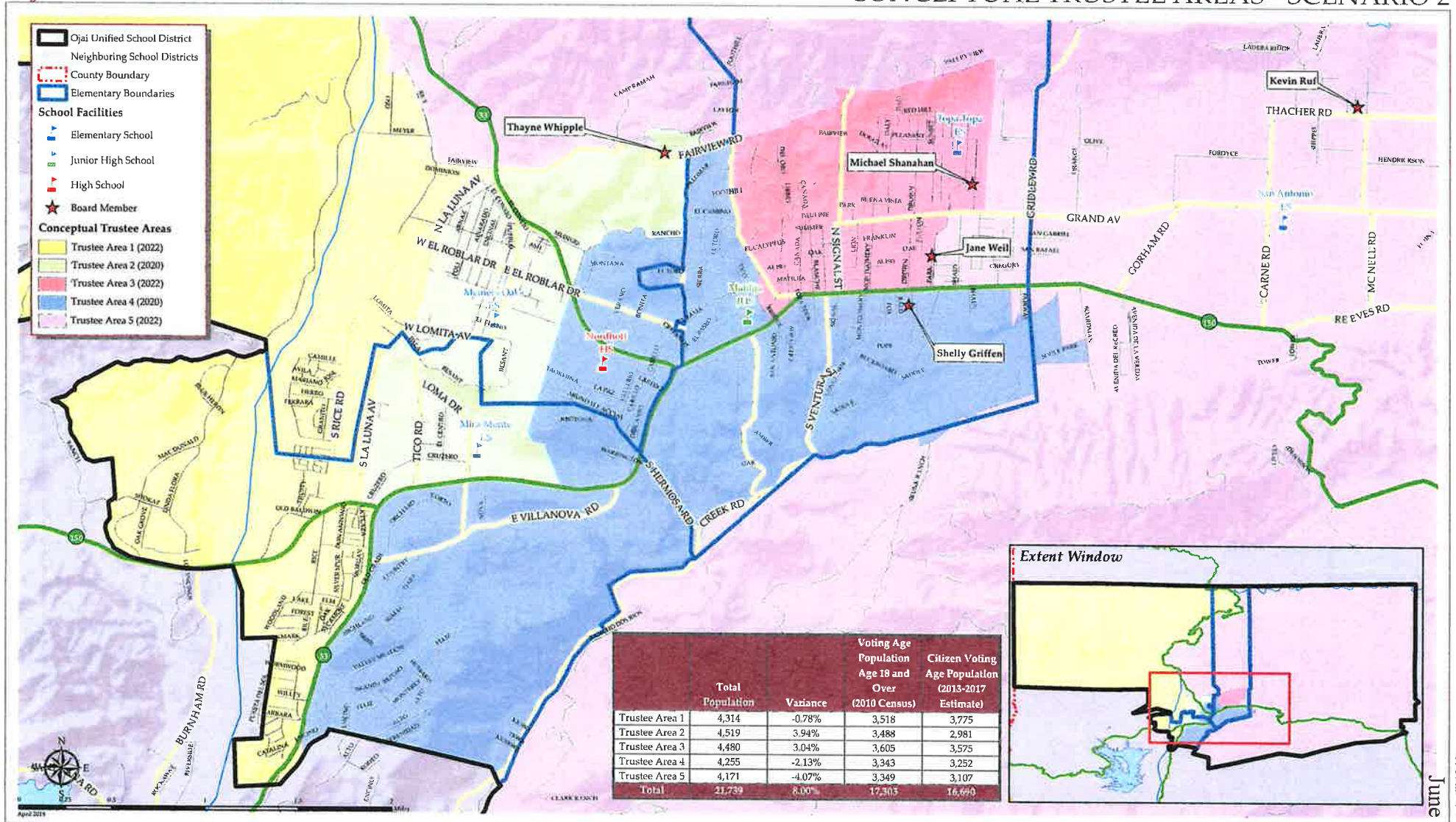

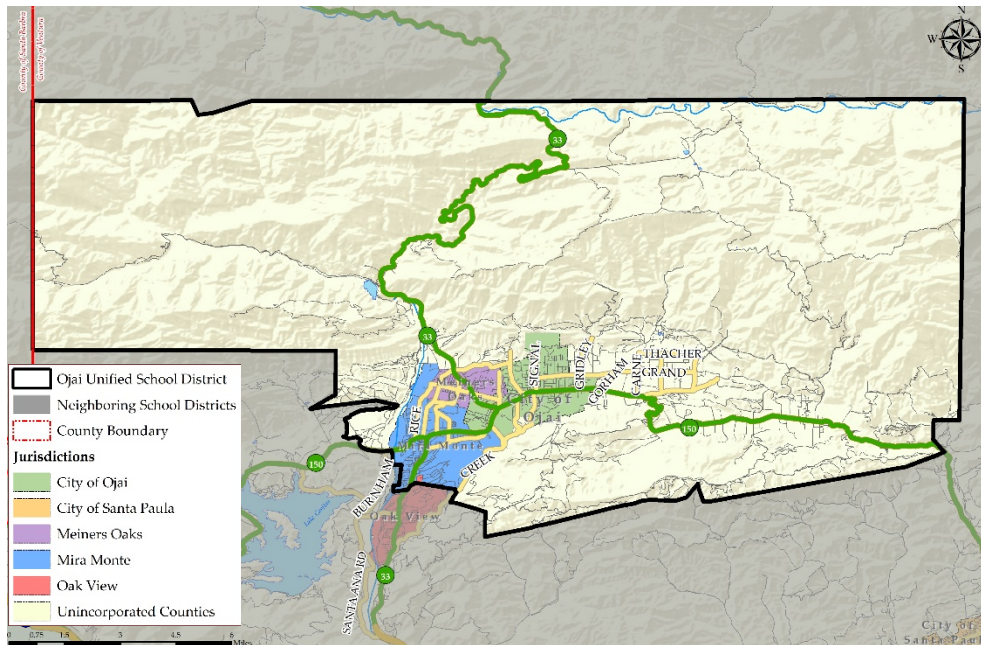


About Us

- School District undertook the transition from at-large method of election to the by-area method of election voluntarily and engaged in an open process to create voting areas that ensured fair representation for all residents



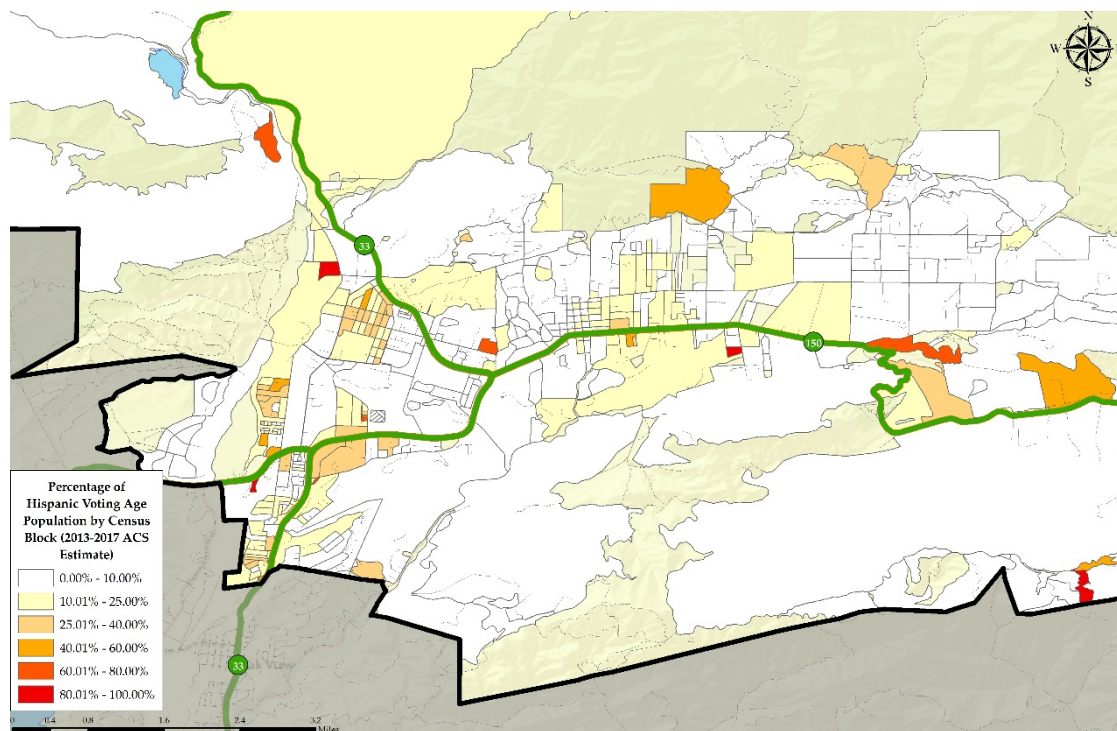

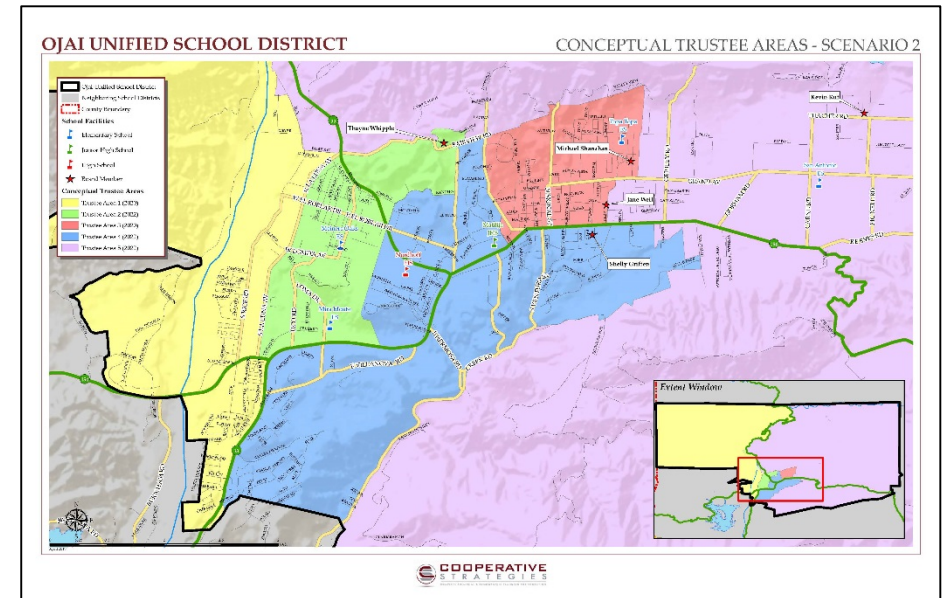
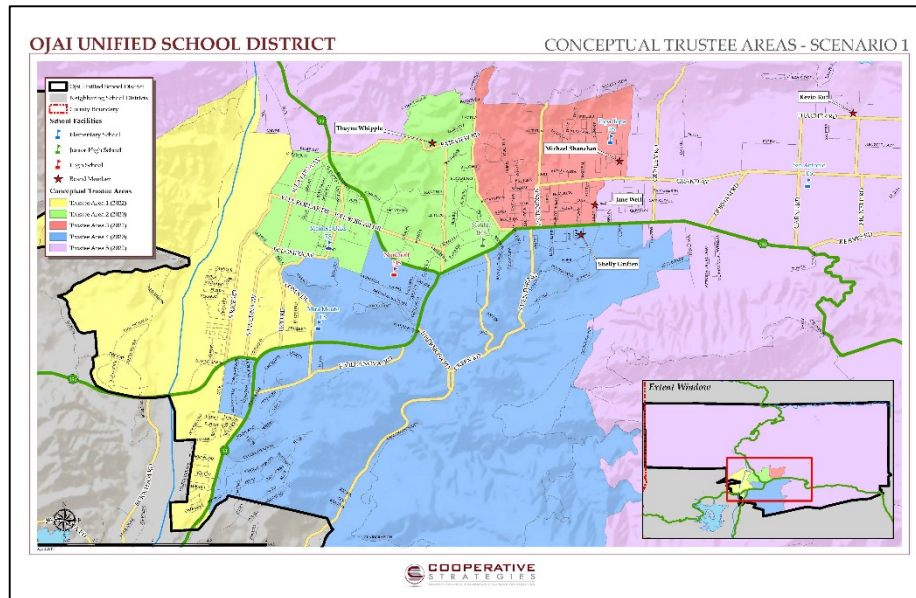

This public hearing is part of the statutory process for establishing a "by-trustee area" elections system. In a by-trustee area elections system, the Ojai Unified School District would be divided into trustee areas and each Governing Board member would be elected by only the registered voters in the particular trustee area where the Governing Board member resides. The Governing Board is currently elected using an at-large elections system, in which all Governing Board members are elected by voters of the entire Ojai Unified School District. At two previous public hearings, the District's demographics received input into the creation of draft trustee area map plan scenarios which were subsequently shared with the public at community input meetings held on May 1, 2019 and May 3, 2019. By law, the District must conduct at least two public hearings on the map plans prior to selecting a final by-trustee area election map for the election of Governing Board members commencing in November of 2020.

The Ojai Unified School District currently elects its Board of Education members through an at-large election system. Under this system, candidates for the Board of Education can reside anywhere in OUSD's area of service and are elected by the registered voters that reside within OUSD's area of service.

OUSD did not receive a demand letter as of yet. We are hoping to make this change before receiving a demand letter and facing any litigation. On March 23th, 2019 the Ojai Unified School District Board of Education members adopted a resolution declaring their intent to investigate a transition to an By-Trustee Area Election System. The resolution of intent can be found [here](#).

Pursuant to [Election Code Section 10010](#), OUSD will conduct a series of public hearings over the next 90 days to receive community input on the composition of proposed election geographic areas for Board of Education seats. It is of the utmost important that residents participate and provide feedback during the upcoming public hearings. It is the District's desire to ensure that the proposed By-Trustee Areas reflect communities of interest and that the community is involved in this process.

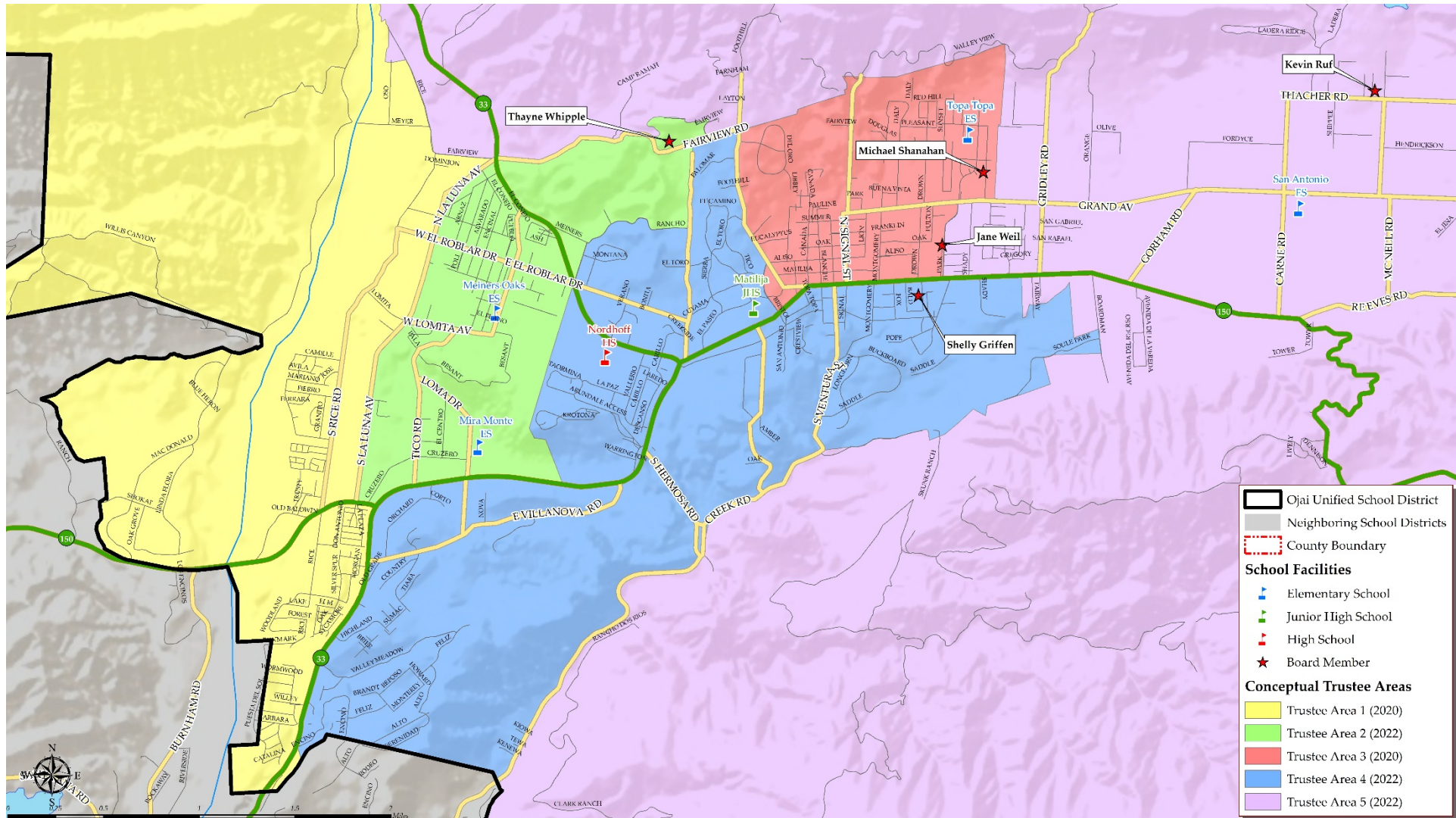
